Future meetings

First, there was an update regarding the Korean Peptide and Protein Society (by Jeong Kyu Bang). Their 2025 symposium will be held in Phoenix Island.

The Indian Peptide Society (by T. Govindaraju) provided an update. In 2023 their symposium was held in Goa. It is intended that in alternating years the symposia will be mainly for young researchers. The symposium in 2025 will be held in Pune. The symposium in 2029 will likely be in New Delhi.

The Chinese Peptide Society will organize their symposium in 2026 in Beijing and they are hoping for over 1000 participants.

The Japanese Peptide Symposium is being held every year. The symposium in 2025 will be in Fukuoka, while the symposium in 2026 is planned to be held in Hiroshima. Plans for 2027 are ongoing.

The Australian Peptide Association (by Lara Malins) told that their 2025 symposium will be in held Tasmania.

Peptides and Proteins Society in Singapore (by Rachel Ee) informed that they have normally 150 attendees at their symposia.

Finally, the European Peptide Society provided an update on future symposia, 2026 in Vienna and 2028 in Lille.
